# meeting, which is June 7<sup>th</sup>. CHOPPER CORNER

I have had several members show interest in the helicopters since last month and a few questions seem to keep coming up so I thought I would address them this month.

The most common question I have been receiving is people wanting to know how the choppers we are flying are able to maintain in an inverted position. Obviously fullscale are not able to do this, at least without plummeting to ground! On model choppers, we fully control the pitch of blades and we set this pitch range with as much negative as positive. The pitch at bottom stick will be full negative and top stick full positive. We then use the common helicopter programming to set a throttle curve to match these pitches so that as the pitch increases (negative or positive) the throttle increases also so the blades don't loose rotor speed. So if my heli is inverted, my stick on transmitter will be toward the bottom feeding the negative.

One other question I have received is, apparently a few members have simulators at home and wondered if they were somewhat accurate. The answer is YES!!!! I have known a couple fellows learn to hover on a sim and come out to field and within one tank of fuel we're successfully holding heli in a hover. So if you do have a sim, go ahead and it give it a try!!!!!


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Soap Box By John Burdin
