There is a learning curve, and you don't start without proper training. Then after initial training, you are placed at level that you are comfortable with. Judging does take concentration. You may be on the flight line for up to two hours at a time looking a different pilots, airplanes and maneuvers. The discipline required is not rigorous, but it is taxing, and can be fun, and very rewarding.

I have judged thousands of aerobatic, pattern and IMAC flights through the years, and view it as a challenge, and enjoyed every minute of it. Judging may also help you build your skills as you see how many pilots fly, and how they deal with all the adversity thrown their way. Cross winds, cold, hot, etc. are all elements a pilot must deal with when it's his or her turn to fly. When it's time to go, you go.

Congratulations to our American cousins on NASA's successful Mars landing by the spacecraft Spirit. An incredible achievement!


But I have to say that the Spirit design does bear a passing resemblance to the 'Macx Mars Probe'

I wonder if he runs this on 20% or 30% nitro!??








New Gate Signs
