Making a Difference

There has been a lot written and posted on the internet over the past six to twelve months regarding the AMA leadership. Some good, and a lot of very negative things have been written.

It seems that the leadership in Muncie has decided to wage war on the parts of the R/C model community that it doesn't want to become educated about. Adding fuel to the fire, the AMA seems to be picking on the various SIGS (significant interest groups) which have propped up the AMA from the mid 1980's through the mid to late 1990's.

For those of you who are not aware of how the AMA works, here is a brief lesson. The AMA is largely managed by an Executive Director, lead by and elected President and governed by an elected executive committee. One vice president from each AMA district. We are in district five, and Jim McNeill from Birmingham, Alabama is our representative. The EC sets the policy, makes the rules and does the heavy lifting. By nature it is a relatively tight nit group. The president has no vote in EC matters, but as most chief executives, he does influence attitudes, initiatives and the direction of the EC.

The AMA moved to Muncie Indiana in the early 1990's from the Washington, DC area, and spent about five years tying up all the loose ends of the move, and building a new national flying site. Although the national flying site was largely completed just a few years ago, there is continuing work on the facility and museum.


In matters of government relations at the federal level the AMA has been outstanding. Issues of frequency's for our use is a continuing problem as technical development of the nations communication systems expands. Our freedom to fly in light of "9/11" has been preserved, if not expanded, and the AMA has people who work tirelessly assisting R/C clubs with community relations, preserving and building new flying sites.

The challenges of the twenty first century have not been met, and they continue to fail on this issue. The challenges of new technologies that are allowing AMA members to fly higher, faster and more nimble models. About twelve years ago the words "giant scale" was becoming ingrained in our vocabularies. Yes big airplanes with eighty inch wing spans!!! Big engines running on gasoline swinging twenty inch props!!!, Racing airplanes weighing twenty five pounds and going nearly 200mph were a hot item. Helicopters were starting to enter a new era in the mid 90's with bigger engines and more sophiscated radios to do the work. The term "3-D" was the new buzz word. By the late 90's we had another phenomem, turbine jet engines, creating the truest of scale airplanes.

Here we are, 2004 and all of the things I just mentioned have become even bigger, faster, more reliable and in most regards safer. Yet, with twelve years dealing with all of these subjects and more, the AMA is still operating with a 1960's mentality. It's truly amazing to me that they have all but ignored the obvious; Technical innovation. It's like the guys in Muncie have been a time warp. They act like all of this was thrust upon them yesterday, in stead of the ten plus years they have avoided it.

It's time we all worked to make a change. The only way the AMA as we know it today will survive, and as modelers we can survive is to vote in change. Where it starts for our club is with the District VP. He needs to go, and I will write more on that in later issues. Tony Stillman is running for the District 5 VP, and I am supporting him in this year's election. I have known Tony for a long time, and if we can get five or six guys like Tony on the EC we will have <u>Made a Difference</u>.
