THE FLIGHT LINE

I don't know about the rest of you, but I sure am glad that we are almost at that point where we can sit back and relax a little. This past spring has been a very busy one for the club with Florida Jets, the Southern 500 Pylon Races, Top Gun and Planes, Trains & Automobiles and I for one would like to get back to flying my airplanes.

Before we get too comfortable though, we have a little yard work to do! At our last meeting, it was decided to schedule Saturday morning June 7th as a Field Cleanup Day! We have been talking for quite a while about burying the cable that was purchased to run power to the two shelters from the generator near the storage shed for future events. I have arranged to get a trencher for that morning and it should take no time at all to run the lines to the "concessions" pavilion and to the main pavilion.

Several of the railroad ties have deteriorated badly and are in need of replacing. Terry Crosby (vice-president) had made arrangements with one of his neighbors that work's for CSX to have some replacements brought by the field a few weeks back. I believe that Ian Clark has already got a game plan to be able to move these close to where they need to go without having to lift and carry them.

There are approximately 5 - 6 fence posts along the front fence that need to be replaced and the wire secured to them. If we can run a few weed eaters at the same time, we can then spray the entire fence line with Round-Up. I have had a few new signs made to replace the weathered once at the front gate too.

I know that this all sounds like a lot but if we can get a good turnout of members, with a few shovels (to fill in the trench), one or two weed eaters (we have one at the field already), a set of post hole diggers (or two) and the bodies to use to use them, it should take no more than a few hours. I would like to see us get started around 7:30 - 8:00 AM and finish by 10:00 before it gets to warm. If anyone would like to bring some things out for a swap meet – feel free to do so!

We are grateful to Wally Sundey for his tremendous effort in selling tickets for our club raffle. With his efforts we managed to do very well.

New Events: Keep May 17 open for Planes, Trains and Automobiles sponsored by the Plant City Chamber of Commerce. Our club has again been invited to attend and set up a static display and flight demonstrations. This gives us the opportunity to encourage others to come and share our enjoyment of the hobby. **National Aviation Day** is scheduled for August 17, at our field. Old Business: Our gate combination was changed last month after the City of Mulberry removed all of their water pipes from our property.
