Jeff flew this model at the aforementioned E-jet Fest and wound up taking the top spot for the fastest "foam" EDF jet.



# IRCC APRIL 2020 Award Winner JEFF HUGHES

The April 2020 Society of Aircraft Demolishers "Aircraftus Fragmentum" was called to order by the President of the IRCC via email during this pandemic! There were 3 nominees for this prestigious award this month! Jeff Hughes, with his F-18; Tommy Nolin with is AvantiS and Bob Grahl with an unknown aircraft. Like an anvil falling on Wile E. Coyote in a Bugs Bunny Road Runner cartoon, the email votes for our very own chief instructor were overwhelming and a crushing victory over the other nominees; Mr. Jeff Hughes reigned supreme with his F-18 Blue Angel!

Of special significance, this is the second SAD nomination of Mr. Hughes for an F-18 Blue Angel crash, and his first "win"! We are unexpectedly excited for him with this recent "win"

When I was a boy, and interested in all things that flew, I remember my father, an Air Force Officer, telling me about pilots actually flying into the ground. It's hard to believe, but it is true, it is a phenomenon called "target fixation". Target fixation usually occurs in training and sometimes in combat, where a fighter pilot rolling in on a target is so fixed on dropping his bombs on target that they actually lose situational awareness of their proximity to the ground and they fly their aircraft into the ground instead of pulling up in time. Most of these incidents happen in training missions as the pilot is being graded for proficiency and accuracy. By all accounts, target fixation is very real and a tragic loss of life in the full-scale aircraft community.

If you know Jeff Hughes, you know he is a great guy who loves to talk about flying and tech talk on how stuff works mechanically, and he is also the IRCC's Chief Flight Instructor! He has given many a budding pilot their first "ride" on the IRCC's trainer and he has also soloed many new RC pilots! Another thing that you may or may not know about Jeff is, he loves to go fast! He recently won the IRCC's "Fastest Foam Jet" at the Florida eJet Fest International competition with a speed run of 165 mph and thanks to SKY RC, he now has an onboard "gizmo" that tells him how fast he goes. He will, without a doubt, push an airplane to its limits! Which is exactly what happened on this day.

On a clear sunny afternoon at the IRCC, Jeff pushed the throttle forward and with his SKY RC speed meter on board, he began a series of speed runs on this Freewing 90mm F/A-18 Blue Angel Hornet! Jeff had a great flight going on and then, while Jonathan Fiermonti was flying and yours truly were on the flight line, Jeff made a couple of high-speed passes that were by all accounts, excellent and exciting to watch! On his third pass, Jeff rolled in on his target, i.e. the runway and at full acceleration began his speed run, however, his jet kept getting lower and lower to the runway as it continued to accelerate! As quickly as you could think about it, the aircraft descended below 1-foot AGL (above ground level) and within the blink of an eye...S-P-L-A-T!!!! Styrofoam Giblets A la carte!

At the moment Jeff's F/A-18 Blue Angel impacted the runway at high velocity, the aircraft impacted the center line of the IRCC runway on a heading of 090 (east) directly in front of Jonathan Fiermonti and I and the impact was spectacular! The aircraft was in about a 5-degree shallow high-speed dive when it impacted the runway and destroyed itself! The airframe split into three pieces and debris, such as the battery and SKY RC Speed Meter continued forward, free from the fuselage at an amazing velocity! The lipo battery was found 100 yards from the initial impact and the Sky RC Speed Meter was found 50 yards away with a peak speed reading of 117mph!

Postmortem analysis indicates that there were one of two probable causes or a combination thereof. The Freewing F/A-18 is known to have an elevator issue that is required to be fixed prior to flight if you have one of the earlier production models. Another theory is that Jeff's desire to push the airplane to the maximum and he got target fixated on the speed run. I personally believe the elevator failed and that the combination of the speed run with mechanical failure made for an epic Styrofoam stew across the runway! I'm just glad I had a front row seat approximately 30 feet from the impact. It was very exciting and fun to watch!

It is with great honor and pride that we offer this month's SAD patch to Mr. Hughes, who has fearlessly won this month's SAD Patch Award! It is the fourth noted crash of the 2020 flying season; an award that we are all subject to earning at any given time in consolation for our stricken aircraft who we bravely launch into the skies in a constant pursuit of our Constitutional right to pursue and find happiness.

Thank you, Jeff, for this offering to the SAD community! Until next month...
