**TOP GUN** will be hosted at Paradise Field Wednesday October 28 to Sunday November 1, 2020 and the IRCC is in need of Volunteers to staff the event. Please contact David DeWitt to set up a volunteer time. If you can only spare an hour or two of your time over the 5-day event, it will be helpful! Please volunteer and do your part on this major RC event that greatly benefits the IRCC! If you're at high risk during this pandemic or if you're sick or if you've tested positive for COVID-19, please assess your personal risk to the virus if you're high risk and if you're sick or test positive, please stay at home.

November 21& 22, 2020 we will host the Merry Boozer's Toys for Tots Fly-in. The Merry Boozers are an RC YouTube Channel. This will be a great event for our club to showcase our facility and hospitality. Any plane can fly at the fly-in as long as it is not a turbine. Entry is AMA members, \$10 plus an unwrapped toy.

Both charging stations in the main pavilion are up to 200 watts of charging power each! This does not mean everyone can charge at once, but if you're charging, be courteous and please share the power stations.

Our webmaster, Ron McKie, has made changes to the IRCC website. You will need a login account to gain access to the IRCC members section to get copies of the newsletter and other important information for club members.

We have filed our 501C with the IRS and our check has been cashed by the Federal Government. We are in communication with the IRS and all seems to be going well. We are awaiting final confirmation that the 501C status has been restored.

The 100 RC Missions Over Florida is alive and well and we are continuing to generate lots of sorties, which seems to be keeping the membership alive and well! Even if you get your "100", please keep logging your sorties throughout the year as it is interesting to see the number of sorties that get logged by our members! We have had three members cross the 100 Mission mark this year, see the 100 Missions roll call at the end of this article.

Please do not fly over our northern boundary, which is the Se7en Wetlands and a bird sanctuary just north of our field. If you see someone flying over the wetlands say something to that pilot! This will take all of our members to help with this matter. Awareness is key.

As a reminder, if you look in this newsletter, The IRCC membership unanimously approved a parking plan for the IRCC that is now in effect on each weekend and during events. If you are not coming to the IRCC to fly, please park away from the main pavilion in one of the approved non-flying spots. There is an approved IRCC parking diagram of the "where to park" in this issue of the Propwash and we will keep it in there for perpetuity. If you are not here to fly, please keep the spots near the pavilion open and don't park in the field, which allows flyers with trailers the opportunity to have "swing room" to back in their trailers.

If you're unsure, ask the person in question to see their AMA and who their IRCC sponsor is. As a member of the IRCC you have that right.

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### **IRCC MEETING MINUTES**

### Saturday October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020 Recorded by Club Secretary - Jim Giallombardo

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by 27 attending members.

**Meeting to Order:** The monthly meeting of the IRCC was called to order at 10:02 am by President Jerry McGhee.

New Members and Guests: Former Member Gary Marshall, and guest Rudy?

**Awards and Certificates:** David Raff received his Sportsmanship award for a superior newsletter for the month of August.

Richard Moffatt received his Sportsmanship award for the diligent work acquiring the much-needed fire extinguishers.

Dennis Peterson received his Model of the month for September.

Wally Sunday received his 100 mission's patch.

**Minutes:** A motion to accept the September minutes as posted in the club newsletter, Propwash, was made and accepted.

**Treasurers Report:** Jerry McGhee presented the treasurer's report for Gary Snyder in his absence. The IRCC is currently in good shape and has money in the bank. As the end of the year is approaching, non- essential spending will be curbed at this time. A special vote was held to install Steve Jaworski as the new treasurer prior to the official elections to be held in November. Steve along with Terry are working together on completing additional requested IRS forms.

### IRCC OCTOBER 2020 Award Winner GEORGE NAUCK

The October 2020 Society of Aircraft Demolishers "Aircraftus Fragmentum" was called to order by the President of the IRCC! Like a torrential rain in an outer feeder band of a Cat 4 Hurricane, SAD patch nominations blew in from the left, the right and from the

center of the speaking floor! It appeared at first glance that all members of the IRCC splattered a plane or two in the last 30 days, however, as the dust settled, the new precedented all-time crash nominations of 7 hit the nomination altar! All were well deserving of this prestigious monthly award, however, the IRCC membership heard ALL nominations and, in the end, it was veteran pilot, George Nauck, who seized the opportunity to claim this not-so-coveted honor.

The P-51 Mustang, the aircraft that allowed the Allies to win the war in Europe by staying with the Allied bombers all the way to Berlin and paved the way for the total Allied victory in Europe. By all accounts, the P-51 is beloved by nearly all fighter pilots, aviation historians, aviation fans and RC Modelers across the world! George Nauck was brave enough to model this aircraft as an RC and he was successful in claiming Model of the Month at the IRCC in August with this very large sport scale ARF of the Mustang with the nose art "Short Fuse Sallee"! For no less than 2 months, George could be seen at the IRCC every weekend firing up his Mustang and going on patrol looking for Axis aircraft to dogfight and the occasional MiG! Thankfully, George kept us Fokker free during his fighter sweeps around the IRCC aerodrome!

Please excuse me with artistic license while I digress from this tale of woe to set-up the coup de grace of this P-51 Mustang! When I was a kid, I use to spend my summers on my Grandparents Tobacco farm in South Central Virginia and I helped my Grandparents tend their 168-acre tobacco farm and their 70-acre cattle farm. After many long, hot, humid, sweaty Virginia days in the tobacco field and feeding cattle, every Saturday night, my Grandfather liked to watch WWE wrestling and I enjoyed watching it with him as I usually picked up a few moves to experiment on the regular fights I would get in with my older brothers. I found that the WWE was a wonderful resource to pick up some ideas as I tested it on my classmates, brothers and as I got older and stronger, it helped me as a bouncer in college and the occasional drunken bar fights and football fisticuffs at my University! Great fun! A few of the moves that always impressed me was the top rail dive from Jimmy "Super Fly" Snuka and any wrestler that employed the Piledriver; the piledriver is a professional wrestling move in which the wrestler grabs their opponent, turns them upside-down, and drops into a sitting or kneeling position, driving the opponent head-first into the mat.

On the morning of September 27, 2020, George set-out for a routine fighter sweep over the IRCC aerodrome to annihilate any enemy aircraft in the IRCC airspace. Shortly after George's P-51 broke ground and began to fly, the aircraft jumped to the top rail and violently pitched over into a piledriver nose in, full throttle, unrecoverable crash from about 50 feet or so. This completely turned the tables on George's fighter sweep and wound up annihilating his Mustang. There is much speculation as to the root cause of George's crash of his beautiful, young Mustang, but the accident is still under investigation.

It is with great honor and pride that we offer this month's SAD patch to Mr. Nauck, who has courageously won this month's SAD Patch Award! It is the tenth noted crash of the 2020 flying season; an award that we are all subject to earning at any given time in consolation for our stricken aircraft who we bravely launch into the skies in a constant pursuit of our Constitutional right to pursue and find happiness.

### **MODEL of THE MONTH!**



During the October meeting, Jim Giallombardo and Captain Mike Porter presented their entry for Model of The Month an ASM C-130 Hercules aircraft. The following is a short write up from Jim on the history of this R/C Model and a few pictures of the transformation from it's beginning as a multi-engine "Coast Guard" model to the presented version in the US Navy Blue Angels support aircraft "FAT ALBERT"

The Hercules with a 100-inch wingspan, was originally purchased by Captain Mike. Over a period of about 5 years the Captain constructed it into a beautiful Coast Guard model, representative of his Alma Mater. The model was transported around the country during the Captain's travels, achieving hundreds if not thousands of "air miles". The aircraft only flew a few times under its own power before it was retired from flight. It was later relegated for many years as a static hanging display in one of the Captain's favorite refreshment establishments. The model eventually found its way into Jim's hands. Not a builder, Jim saw the potential to revive the model into something entirely new. The restoration began with stripping the old livery down to the bare fuselage.





The wings, tail and horizontal services were covered in a monocoat finish which was removed. It took considerable time to remove the old glue and sand the surfaces smooth. Upon examination, it was discovered that the leading edges on both main wings were broken. The right main wing also suffered a broken trailing edge and 4 crushed ribs. The balsa sheeting was peeling back revealing the damage. New ribs were hand cut and fit into place. The leading and trailing edges were straightened and reinforced with stiffeners then epoxied into position. Two E-flite 52 size motors were fitted to each main wing and programmed with counter rotating propellers.

Both main wings were then weighed to equal amounts to avoid any roll tendencies on such a large aircraft. A battery box was constructed in the center of the fuselage directly under the CG to house the four 6s 5000mAh batteries, one for each motor. Robart air retracts were then mounted for the 4 main wheels and the two-small nose/steering wheels. After extensive sanding and cleaning was complete, a match for the official Blue Angel Blue was obtained.

This Blue paint was applied with a small spray bottle and compressor. It took approximately 5 coats of painting and sanding over a month. The white came from a bright white Rustoleum spray can. Some Yellow areas were also painted using a Rustoleum Sunset Yellow. Three finish coats were applied with a Rustoleum Clear Gloss. The graphics were supplied by Callie graphics and the yellow matched the painted portion perfectly. The entire project was a particularly challenging venture for a non-builder. Over the course of a year's reconstruction, the Hercules was transformed into a beautiful example of the C130 support aircraft assigned to the US Navy Blue Angels!

### IRCC MEMBERS IN ACTION

During the October meeting, a proposal was put forth to do away with the smaller 20lb propane tanks used when running the generator and have a larger 250-gallon tank installed. This would be professionally filled and maintained and eliminate the need to constantly be changing out the empty tanks for full ones. The upfront cost was a little pricy but would balance itself out after a few years.

Since we are at the end of the year and lost some of the usual additional revenue due to the pandemic, the proposal was tabled temporarily.

Member Al Coffey (and his wife) decided that there was no reason to wait and generously offered to provide the money to make it happen.

Hearing this from Club President Jerry McGhee, Bill Pawl and Jim Giallombardo then set out to make a concrete foundation for the tank to sit on and dug a trench to the generator to run the line underground.







A few days later the new tank was installed, tested, and filled.

This will be primarily be used to run the generator during special events held at the IRCC like the IRCC Toys for Tot's Fun Fly sponsored by the Merry Boozers in November and the 3rd Annual Florida E-Jet Fest in February.


