IRCC MEETING MINUTES

Saturday October 3rd, 2020 Recorded by Club Secretary - Jim Giallombardo

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by 27 attending members.

Meeting to Order: The monthly meeting of the IRCC was called to order at 10:01 am by President Jerry McGhee.

New Members and Guests: Tommy Walker, Dave Mineo, Dutch Weis, Eric Rockey, Jim Mahonney, Laura, James & Drew Powell.

Awards and Certificates: Keith Genske, and Dan Hudson, sportsmanship award for assisting with field maintenance and grass mowing.

Gary Snyder, sportsmanship for his long-time service to the IRCC as club Treasurer.

Cpt Mike Porter and Jim Giallombardo for the C-130 Model of the Month.

Minutes: A motion to accept the October minutes as posted in the club newsletter, Propwash, was made and accepted.

Treasurers Report: Steve Jaworski reported the Club Financial account has been declining over the past several years, however at this time the club account is healthy. We cannot continue along the current rate of spending. Accommodations have been made with snowbirds and members, but the membership needs to rise. Steve also reminded all members they need to renew their AMA membership for club renewal. IRCC members assisted with the FTE Top Gun event, holding a raffle for prizes awarded winning participants.

IRCC members may contact the Treasurer for full details regarding the status of the club's financial account.

Membership Report: We currently have 116 members.

Field and Maintenance Report: Bill Pawl gave his report on the status of the field. Mowing has slowed greatly this time of the year. Bill continues to spray fire ant mounds as they appear.

The infield windsock has been relocated permitting TO & Landing access to the NE-SW diagonal runway.

The flag and the flagpole at the main pavilion are both damaged and need replaced. It was approved by membership to replace these items.

Instructors Report: Jeff Hughes reported everything is going well. All club trainers are in good shape. Jeff has taken on three new pilot trainees.

Safety Report: President Jerry reported in the absence of Richard Moffatt, no concerns at this time.

Club Newsletter/Website: The club newsletter is going well. David Raff thanked everyone for their submission and asked to keep them coming in. Ron McKie reported that several members were inadvertently deleted from the website; they will need to re-register.

New Field Search Committee: Jim Giallombardo reported no new search information at this time.

Old Business: Jerry McGhee encouraged members to continue with the 100-mission goal for 2020. It is important all members continue to log "all" their flights to support IRCC flight activity.

All members are continuously encouraged to avoid overflight of the bird and wildlife sanctuary north of the field boundaries.

Steve Jaworski reported the IRS has not responded to the new information submitted they requested. Steve researched the archives and retrieved the original IRCC articles which were submitted to the IRS as part of the package. He placed these articles into a permanent file book which is to be passed onto each successive club treasurer. This procedure will be written into the IRCC bylaws.

New Business and Future Events: President Jerry advised all members to pay close attention to the public comment section regarding the FAA new rules which is to become law in the next 10 days. This law will require mandatory testing for all Community Based Organizations Members.

All the furniture located at the pavilions has been donated. Many of the chairs and tables have become unusable over time and have been thrown away. It is requested the property be taken care of by members and if anyone has knowledge of free usable replacement items to please advise.

Top Gun October 2020 will be held as scheduled at Paradise Field. All prizes for the raffle events have been acquired.

The IRCC Toys for Tots Fly-In sponsored by Merry Boozer's You Tube Channel is scheduled for Nov 21-22, 2020. Participants are already planning to arrive on Friday Nov 20. It appears this year's event will be a great success. There will be a \$10.00 entry fee along with an unwrapped toy.

The Florida E-Jet Fest International, is AMA sanctioned for Feb 4-7, 2021.

The IRCC Annual Banquet will be held on Saturday Dec 5, 2020 from 6-9pm at KC's Artisan Pizza on South Florida Ave. The cost will be \$20.00 per person. Members who plan to attend are encouraged to sign up with the total number of guests.

Sportsmanship Award: Al Coffee was nominated for his extremely generous donation to pay for the installation of the propane tank in the memory of his wife, Ellen. The tank will used to be run the generator which powers the facility during club events.

IRCC NOVEMBER 2020 Award Winner TOMMY NOLIN

The November 2020 Society of Aircraft Demolishers "Aircraftus Fragmentum" was called to order by the President of the IRCC! Like a traditional 1-day winter in central Florida, there can only be one SAD winner! After canvasing the membership, an honest broker stood up

stood up and self-nominated for daring to find the structural limits of their aircraft when met with terra-firma! In what was a not-so-pleasant 30-day period to be flying with wicked winds and unusual rain, we owe a debt of gratitude to Mr. Tommy Nolin for stepping into the breach of not-so-many-good flying days and sacrificing his Eflite Havoc to the RC gods so that others may fly!

After several punishing landings testing the structural integrity of his airframe and landing gear on the Eflite Havoc, Tommy diligently repaired his aircraft (as we all do) after a few not so pleasant meeting with Mother Earth on attempted landings. The key to a good landing, as noted by and agreed to by all pilots, is to keep your wings level with the horizon and hit whatever you're going to hit as gently as possible, then repeat with every flight. It is also said that Take-offs are optional; the landing, however, is mandatory. These are tried and true statements of flight among men and birds!

The problem with repair jobs on an RC airframe is the addition of adhesives that tend to layer-up with each repair that culminate in a sneaky problem noted with additional weight. Just like an abandonment of one's daily diet, throwing caution to the wind, weight gain is certain, this holds true with people and when it comes to repairs on airplanes!

The Havoc is a lovely little jet! A true EDF thoroughbred designed to go fast and slow with equal precision in the flight envelope. Most pilots, including Tommy, who have flown the Havoc love it for these high and low speed characteristics. Tommy is no exception, and it was truly a great looking airplane to see in the sky. In Tommy's deposition for this SAD award, he noted that "You can only add so much epoxy before the plane can't take it anymore."

On this fateful day, Tommy gladly pushed the throttle forward with an expectation of normal flight routine to dazzle the IRCC peanut gallery and any passers-by. However, a critical calculation was overlooked from his last repair. The aircraft unhappily launched into the air and began to let Tommy know that this was not going to go as planned! Tommy gallantly fought the aircraft, trying to will it into the places he wanted to go, reaching for altitude to gain time to figure out "what the heck is going on". Some altitude was gained, but without warning, the battle for control switched back to the jet, and the jet decided where it wanted to go. October 28th to November 1st marked the 32nd Annual TOP GUN Invitational Radio Control Tournament held at Paradise Field in Lakeland FL. Patterned after the US Naval Combat School, Top Gun bring the "Best of The Best" in the radio control community to battle it out for the honor of being name Mr. Top Gun! Top Gun is about much more than just how well you can fly. It brings in all of the aspects of building, attention to detail, authenticity and of course flying!

The IRCC was once again asked to assist with the Flight Line Operations & Gate Control for this year's event. Many of you contributed some of your

time to help in one or more of these areas and it was greatly appreciated. However, for those of you that couldn't make it for one reason or another, here is a small re-cap of what you missed.



(Above) The morning starts off - as it should with a rendition of the National Anthem immediately followed by a "pilots briefing" From that point it is all about flying!

(Right) The IRCC Raffle Tent is hard to miss with the banners, American Flag and of course, all of the prizes that are available to be won.



As mentioned previously, this is all about documentation, authenticity, and attention to detail. Aircraft entered in the "advanced categories" must provide documentation of the aircraft and the markings or livery chosen.

As part of the "Static Judging" the builder/pilot must show proof with documentation that the aircraft, with the marking used, existed somewhere in time. An example of this is shown with the Albatross DV below.











Here are a few more examples of some of the aircraft that were on display.









IRCC members help to coordinate the flight line operations to assure that each pilot and aircraft successfully take off and then land upon completion of their "round". What happens in the air is between the pilot and their spotter or caller.







Above are some pictures of the flight line team in action. Coordinated by our vice-president David DeWitt, the team works with the spotter and pilot and the other Flight Line Crew Members to safely allow the pilot at each station to enter the "active" runway for takeoff.

They continue to monitor the "pattern" and communicate via the paddles you see to talk to the others crew members to set their pilots back into the pattern for landing.














At the end of the event the winning numbers were drawn from all of the entries. The lucky winners this year are as follows:
