HAPPY NEW YEAR! I also hope that you all had a great Christmas holiday break! With the promise of a new year comes yet again another great year of opportunity in the Imperial RC Club to fulfill your RC Aviation dreams and desires!

Congratulations to Dennis Peterson who won Model of the Year honors with his kit-built Balsa USA Fokker DR-1 Triplane! This is the fourth year that we have held Model of the Year honors. Dennis' aircraft presentation beat out a very competitive field of 4 kit-built aircraft, 1 scratch built aircraft, 2 custom ARFs and 5 ARFs! In the four years that we have been doing the Model of the Year competition, competing the model of the month winners, the IRCC has only selected kit or scratch-built aircraft as a model of the year winner. The ARFs are certainly allowed, however, the data reflects that the members of the IRCC give a considerable vote of approval to the kit/scratch-built aircraft presented. If you are serious about getting your name on the Model of the Year trophy, this factor of hours spent building take precedence in the voters' opinions when the final votes are tallied.

The 4<sup>th</sup> annual IRCC end of year banquet was held Sunday December 5, 2021. 35 participants met at KC's Artisan Pizza and a great time with great food was had by all! Thank you to David Raff for putting together the running slide show during the evening. Thank you to everyone who participated and attended!

Congratulations to all who received their 100 missions' patch in 2021! This was the 3<sup>rd</sup> year that we held the 100 Missions Over Florida! Congratulations to Jeff Hughes who achieved a 1,002 flights on the year! 57 IRCC members participated in the 100 Missions this year and 25 members achieved 100 flights or more! Consider charging your batteries before coming to the field and/or bringing your own power supply (generator) if you're going to be charging a great deal, especially during peak usage times at the field (usually Saturday and Sunday mornings).

### **Continuous Information Update:**

The 100 RC Missions Over Florida is alive and well for the 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive year! Remember, this is a "Health Barometer"; if you're feeling sick or curmudgeonly, come to the field, log some flights and you're guaranteed to feel better! Even if you get your "100", please keep logging your sorties throughout the year as it is interesting to see the number of sorties that get logged by our members

As a reminder, please do not fly over our northern boundary, which is the Se7en Wetlands and a bird sanctuary just north of our field. If you see someone flying over the wetlands say something to that pilot! The IRCC membership has been doing a great job not flying over this boundary since it was made aware to us in February 2020!

The IRCC membership unanimously approved a parking plan for the IRCC that is now in effect on each weekend and during events. If you're not coming to the IRCC to fly, please park away from the main pavilion in one of the approved non-flying spots. There is an approved IRCC parking plan diagram of the "where to park" in this issue of the Propwash and we will keep it in there for perpetuity. If you're not here to fly, please keep the spots under and near the pavilion open and don't park in the field, which allows flyers with trailers the opportunity to have "swing room" to back their trailers into the pavilion.

No guest should be flying unless they are invited by an IRCC member, the member is present when their guest arrives, and the guest has a valid AMA membership. If you're unsure, ask the person in question to see their AMA and who their IRCC sponsor is, as a member of the IRCC you have that right.







# Secrets to Successful Crosswind Landings



There are two main schools of thought about the best way to set up a landing in a crosswind. The first is the wing-low "side-slip" approach, in which a pilot attempts to prevent wind drift by keeping the wings banking into the wind while cross-controlling the rudder to keep the fuselage aligned with the runway centerline. However, akin to balancing a marble on a bowling ball, probably fewer than one percent of RC pilots have the skill to attempt this. (It's easier in full-scale aviation because heavier airplanes are more stable in wind and thus easier to slip). Furthermore, as the majority of expert pilots know, it's often a waste of time and mental energy to side-slip before getting near the ground because, due to the influence of the terrain and surface friction, the winds are constantly changing the closer the plane gets to the ground. Consequently, while it's always good to anticipate what is coming next, a pilot won't actually know what wind corrections will be needed until shortly before touchdown.


The pros—the ones who make everything look easy—use the easier approach of allowing the airplane to crab into the wind until shortly before touchdown. In reality, expert pilots pay little attention to where the plane is pointing or how much it is crabbing during the approach. Instead, our only concern is keeping the airplane as a whole tracking the centerline and executing a perfect flare.

We will then smoothly kick out the crab right before the wheels touch while continuing to counter any drifting with the ailerons as needed.

The great thing about RC is that our vantage point outside the airplane makes it easy to see when the wheels are about to touch, and thus exactly when to kick out the crab.

The best solutions are usually the simple ones: expert pilots don't pay much attention to whether the wings are banked into the wind or care which wheels touch the ground first, only that we distinguish ourselves by touching down smoothly and perfectly tracking the centerline. If the upwind wheel happens to touch down first while we're making the necessary aileron inputs to keep the airplane over the centerline, that's fine, but maintaining the centerline and smoothest possible touchdown are always our primary concerns.
