The National Model Aviation Day 2022 was a huge success for the IRCC on August 13, 2022! Congratulations to the winners of the 5th annual Tri-Fecta Fun Fly and the many members of the IRCC who participated in the AMA's National Model Aviation Day at IRCC!

In reviewing the past winners of the Tri-Fecta Fun Fly a few notable mentions:

- Wesley Miller who finished first this year overall in 2022 with 220 points moving up from his 2nd place overall finish in 2021 with 180 points.
- Drew Powell, who's only been flying a little over a year (at 14 years old) finished very strong with a 2nd place overall finish with 180 total points!
- Orbin Lopez who finished 3rd place overall in 2022 with 175 points, he also won the tiebreaker with Wally Sundey who also finished with 175 points, however, Orbin won two events and Wally won one which gave the tiebreaker to Orbin. The August 2022 IRCC SAD Committee came to order like bar room brawl, with many new nominees...too many to mention in fact! All, eager to get out their stories of woe! But alas it was the self-admitted nomination of this months winner who won the prize of the August SAD Award! Mr. Matt Hyatt who successfully wiped out 50% of his fleet in one day by crashing two aircraft!


This model aviator recounts a true story of THE American Fighter Pilot of ALL-TIME, Brigadier General Robin Olds, who was not only a WWII ace in a P-38 and P-51 Mustang but went on to wipe out 50% of the North Vietnamese MiG 21 fleet in one day!

January 2nd, 1967, then Colonel Robin Olds, Commander of the 8th Tactical Fighter Wing in Ubon Ratchathani Royal Thai Air Base in Thailand, planned a mission to trick the North Vietnamese by disguising attacking F-4 Phantoms as F-105s to get the North Vietnamese to come up and fight, thinking they were fighter bombers like the F-105 Thunderchief a.k.a "Thud". The plan was given the green light and on January 2nd Robin Olds' plan worked just as planned and they wiped out 50% of the MiG 21 fleet by shooting down 8 MiG-21s! It is quite the accomplishment in military aviation, and you can read about it in Fighter Pilot, the autobiography of Robin Olds, published by his daughter Christina Olds after his death, available at Amazon.com, Audible audio books and Kindle Reader. I have personally read the book and listened to it on Audible books (audio books) and I really enjoy the Audible version of the story the best. Like Colonel Olds, Matt chose to wipe out 50% of his Communist manufactured fleet in one day as a single day opus to Colonel Old's legacy.

It is with great honor and pride that we offer this month's SAD patch to Mr. Hyatt for the SAD Patch Award! It is the eighth noted crash of the 2022 flying season; an award that we are all subject to earning at any given time in consolation for our stricken aircraft who we bravely launch into the skies in a constant pursuit of our Constitutional right to pursue and find happiness.

Thank you, Matt for this offering to the SAD community!


Chuck Miller of the Merry Boozers was also a big winner for the day after having the winning ticket for the 50/50 drawing that was held!

During the August meeting, it was requested that I re-publish the article provided by member Gary Snyder back in September of 2019 on how to set up the "Throttle-Cut" setting up your Futaba or Spectrum radios.

How to Program "Throttle Cut" in Spektrum and Futaba Transmitters

As we discussed at last month's meeting, Throttle Cut is an important safety feature included in all Spektrum and Futaba transmitters. When you receive your transmitter, Throttle Cut is inhibited so it must be programmed in each of your electric powered models.

The purpose of Throttle Cut is to prevent accidental starting of the propeller in your model which could result in injury or damage to the aircraft. As you know, electric powered propellers start very quickly, are very sharp, and can easily result in cut fingers or worse. An accidental bump of the throttle stick can result in a serious accident to yourself or to bystanders. With Throttle Cut, the propeller will not start if the throttle stick is bumped or is moved intentionally. Adjustments to the model can be made without fear of an unexpected propeller start. As an additional safety feature, adjustments to models should only be made with the propeller removed!

Throttle Cut does not interfere with any other programming of your model.

How to program Throttle Cut in a Spektrum transmitter

DX9 used for this example

- 1. Throttle Cut is programmed in the Function portion of your transmitter.
- 2. Turn on the transmitter and enter the Function mode by pressing the roller 1 time.
- 3. Using the roller, scroll down to Throttle Cut. Enter Throttle Cut by pressing the roller 1 time.
- Scroll to "inhibit" and press the roller to select. Using the roller, select the switch that you want to use to turn on and off Throttle Cut. Usually switch H is used for this purpose. Push the roller again.
- 5. You will now see Position -130%, Switch H, and Delay Inh.
- Programming is now complete. Raise the Throttle stick to abut 50%, toggle Switch H back and forth and you will see on the monitor the throttle position move back and forth.
- 7. Turn the transmitter off to resume normal operation.

How to program Throttle Cut in a Futaba transmitter

T16SZ used for this example

- 1. Throttle Cut is programmed in the Linkage Menu portion of your transmitter.
- 2. Turn on the transmitter and enter the Linkage Menu.
- 3. Select Throttle Cut.
- 4. You will now see ACT/INH, Cut Position, and Switch.
- 5. Select ACT/INH "ON", Cut Position "0", and Switch "SG"
- Programming is now complete. You may notice that if you raise the throttle stick to about 50% and toggle switch SG that nothing seems to happen. This action is normal. With Futaba, you must first lower the throttle to 0 to engage Throttle Cut.
- 7. Turn the transmitter off to resume normal operation.

Is there any risk using Throttle Cut?

Remember the proper sequence for using the Throttle Cut function is to first reduce the throttle stick to zero and then engage Throttle Cut. In Spektrum transmitters, if you first engage Throttle Cut and then reduce the throttle stick to zero, the inductive load of the motor may generate a voltage spike which can damage your ESC. This action is the same law of physics that GM uses to fire the spark plugs in your car. This problem cannot happen with Futaba transmitters (see item 6 above). Spektrum transmitters are completely safe if you use the proper sequence.

You may have a transmitter model different from the examples above. If these programming directions don't work for you, let me know and I'll be happy to help. Give Throttle Cut a try. . . I think you'll like it.
