
Stick and Rudder

E-jet fest- I think we have much to be proud of for how the event went off this year. I am thankful to all the club members who helped with registration, raffle, concessions, setup, cleanup, and ambassador duties. The weather was perfect for the event with comfortable temperatures and light to moderate wind. Motion RC unveiled their latest EDF, the SR-71 and for our entertainment, Motion RC Product Specialist, Wesley Miller demonstrated the new SR-71 blackbird and new user-friendly helicopters, Contest Director, Jerry McGhee flew daily demonstrations of his 747, the APEX airshow team performed demonstrations with F-18s in formation, F-22 performance, and an A-10 show with a little extra spice. There were a few particularly spicy moments for those pilots when in the early morning on Thursday, I watched the 3, F-18s disappear into the foggy low clouds, they were thankfully able to hook back out and untangle who was flying which airplane. It is probably unnecessary to report that they were unwilling to try to repeat that maneuver!

On behalf of the club, I also want to thank our sponsors for the support shown to the club, FMS, Motion R/C, and Horizon Hobbies. The generosity of these companies, the participants, and the spectators make a tremendous difference in the success of our events.

The E-Jet Fest was able to generate approximately \$3,000 for the IRCC for 2025. The Triade approach (raffle, food, and registration) for revenue generation is working quite well for us and the weather was a huge win to make this happen as well!



Planes, Trains, and Automobiles – Was a great success! The weather looked a little suspect early in the morning but by the time things got rolling, it was still overcast, but a comfortable day. It was great to see the reaction of many of the children as they passed by the display.

During the event, we have a lot of contact with the public, some of whom are experiencing model aviation for the first time. The simulators were a big hit for those interested in trying them out. There were three operating and frequently occupied throughout the day.

If you notice anything broken or destroyed at the IRCC facility, please let Bill Pawl know about it and set the item aside, out of the way so that we may dispose of it properly.

If you're interested in joining the Grass cutting crew and you can spare some time to join the crew, it would certainly be appreciated to give those who are currently on the crew some welcomed relief as it takes a few hours to cut the field so that all of our members can fly safely on our well-manicured field and runways! As a reminder, please do not fly over our northern boundary, which is the Se7en Wetlands and a bird sanctuary just north of our field. If you see someone flying over the wetlands, say something to that pilot! The IRCC membership has been doing a great job not flying over this boundary since it was made aware to us in February 2020!

No guest should be flying unless they are invited by an IRCC member, the member is present when their guest arrives, and the guest has a valid AMA membership. If you're unsure, ask the person in question to see their AMA and who their IRCC sponsor is. As a member of the IRCC you have that right.

Get out to the field, introduce yourself to someone you don't know, and make a new friend, when landing keep your wings level with the horizon and main gears first as gently as you can!




3 Designated spots for IRCC members with handicap placards and they intend to fly during their visit to the IRCC. Non-flying park in yellow spots
