Strange Planes

For those of us who have known George Nauck since he started to fly with us, we can remember some of George's creations he brought to the field in the early days. Here is something from George about his beginnings in R/C, and some pictures from those early days.

I broke into R/C in about 1996 in Jacksonville, Florida. Two years earlier, I had bought an Airtronics Transmitter, and flight pack for an entirely different application. I needed remote control of a video camera 30 feet up on a pole, and I rigged a system using the receiver and servos. Later, I built a better system and had everything I needed to fly R/C except an airplane


As most have observed, I really don't prefer airplanes and helicopters that look like everyone else's. I built this "recycle airplane" from Ace Hardware yardsticks, empty pop cans, FedEx envelopes, and a "high tech" Fizz Keeper to pressurize the interconnected pop cans to stiffen the fuselage.

I think this may have been before Top Gun was organized, so I only turned heads at the club in Jacksonville. The club was located on land surrounded by the city landfill on two sides, so my plane blended in well and was eventually put to rest there.


